

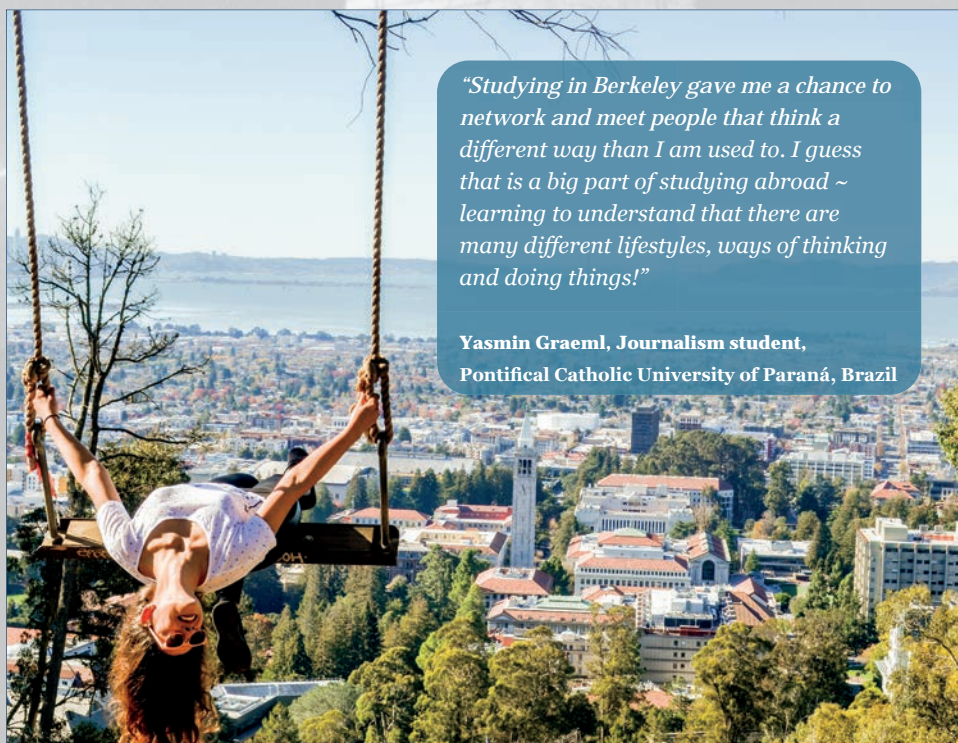
Brilliance in Action

The Berkeley campus is buzzing with life, with more than 42,000 students from California and around the world to create a **dynamic and interconnected community**. Daily activities, performances and events are common on campus and the surrounding area, and is open to both the student population and the general public.

BISP students are encouraged to participate in **student groups**, of which there are over 1,200 available to choose from all over campus.

Students often **travel to fun and exciting places** within California. Common trips include nearby San Francisco, Napa Valley, Lake Tahoe, Yosemite and down the coastal beach areas to Los Angeles, Hollywood and San Diego. During school breaks they may go outside of California to Las Vegas, the Grand Canyon, up the Pacific Northwest to Oregon or Washington, New York, Chicago, Florida, Texas, or a particular favorite, Hawaii.



BISP Makes it Possible

The Berkeley International Study Program (BISP) provides a unique opportunity for visiting international students to take high-quality courses alongside UC Berkeley degree students in a short-term study abroad program for one or two semesters. BISP provides sponsorship and the necessary letter of invitation to obtain a student visa for qualified students, who enroll in courses on a fee-paying basis. We also offer a robust program of activities and support to students who get the much sought-after "Berkeley Experience."

Each semester, BISP sponsors over 400 visiting international students from all over the world, who enjoy the experience of taking classes at the world-famous UC Berkeley. The students do quite well here and have a fantastic experience both in and outside the classroom. BISP students often transfer these courses back to their home universities for their degree requirements.

BISP students come from a wide variety of academic backgrounds. BISP has its roots in an academic department

and continues to maintain a very close relationship with other departments to provide a rich schedule of courses for all students, particularly those in the social sciences, arts, humanities, biological and physical sciences. We have many students from other fields such as business, media, health, education, and politics who find relevant courses in these study areas. It is common in the U.S. for students to take courses in subjects outside of their major. UC Berkeley faculty and students greatly appreciate the participation of students from many cultures in the classrooms, making it an exciting and vibrant multicultural learning environment.

BISP provides a well-rounded, enriching experience with dedicated staff to support them. Students also participate in activities planned by our Cultural Peer Mentors, UC Berkeley students who assist with adjustment to the Berkeley campus and surrounding area, and provide opportunities to get to know other students and the culture of Berkeley and the U.S.

Applying to BISP

BISP has agreements with over 70 universities, in nearly 20 countries. Most students who participate in BISP are nominated by these partner institutions and screened for qualifications which may include academic achievement, proficiency in English, and appropriate study fit. Those from a non-English speaking university must have a TOEFL (90 or higher) or IELTS (7.0 or higher) test score. Students who attend a partner university should inquire at their university's International Office for procedures and deadlines to apply locally for a nomination to attend BISP. We recommend doing this as soon as possible as their deadlines will be earlier than the dates listed below.

Students who do not attend one of our partner universities may apply directly to BISP as an independent student, also called "freemover." Information about this process can be found at <https://bisp.berkeley.edu/apply>. BISP will accept a limited number of students who qualify, if there is space in their chosen area of study.

The general period of time in which BISP accepts independent inquiries for each semester is listed here:

Fall Semester:	Mid-August to Mid-December	February 15 - June 15
Spring Semester:	Mid-January to Mid-May	July 15 - October 15
